The tomb of Queen Jeongsun, the wife of King Danjong Sareung Royal Tomb Historic Site No. 209 D2



In 1456, after the attempt to restore his throne, King Danjong was degraded as to Nosangun and put to death in his exile. Upon this, the queen was also degraded from a

Lady to a government slave. In 1521 (16th year of King Jungjong), when she died at the age of 82, Jungjong performed her funeral with the honor of a lady. In 1698 (24th year of King Sukjong), Danjong was restored in his name and she became Queen Jeongsun. The tomb was named Sareung and Sukjong honored it.

of Emperor Gojong and

founder of Ming dynasty. Yureung is the tomb of Emperor Sunjong, his first wife Empress Sunmyeonghyo, and his second wife Empress Sunjeonghyo, consisting of three rooms in one tomb. Although the structure of Yureung is similar to Hongneung, it has more realistic and advanced stone works.




