4C Seounsansan Mountain Scenic View #5

3E Chiljangsa Temple Scenic View #1

Chiljangsa Temple, which is said to have been built by a Buddhist monk Chiljang in the 5th year of Queen Seondeok's reign (636), creates a tranquil scenery where the quiet and still Chiljangsa Temple is surrounded by the beautiful and lush forest that changes according to the seasons.

2B Cheongwonsa Temple

It is a subsidiary temple of Yongjusa Temple, which is the head temple of Jogye Order District 2. It is well known for the Daeungjeon Hall (Gyeonggido Intangible Cultural Asset No. 174) and Seven-Story Stone Pagoda (Gyeonggido Intangible Cultural Asset No. 116) in front of the Daeungjeon Hall.

4D Seongnamsa Temple Scenic View #3

It was founded by the high priest called Damhwadeoksa in the 20th year of King Munmu's reign during the Silla dynasty. It was later expanded during the Goryeo dynasty. It was named Daejangam when it was greatly by a Buddhist monk Hyego during the Goryeo dynasty. There are province-designated cultural assets such as Yeongsanjeon Hall, where 500 arhats are enshrined, Daeungjeon Hall, and Maeseokbul as well as local relics such as stone pagoda and stone stupa.

2B Unsuam Temple

This Buddhist temple was founded in the 26th year of King King's reign during the Joseon dynasty. It became famous for its signboard that says 'Unsuam,' which was handwritten by Daeungwon to wish national prosperity and the welfare of the people after expanding the temple greatly.

4C Cheongnyongsa Temple

It is a temple founded by a Buddhist monk Myeongbon at the foot of Seounsansan Mountain in 1265 (6th year of King Wonjong's reign during the Goryeo dynasty). It was named Daejangam when it was first founded, but it was later renamed as Cheongnyongsa Temple after a Buddhist monk Hyegwon expanded the temple greatly in 1364 (13th year of King Gongminwang's reign).

4D Yonghwasa Temple

It is said that Yonghwasa Temple was constructed after a Buddhist monk Solhyeon had a dream on his way to his hometown on a missionary task, where a dragon soared to the sky, and looked down at the land where it came from. The temple is said to have been built on that land.

3B Anseong Machum Museum

2B Anseong March First Independence Movement Memorial Hall

It is one of the three places in Korea that entered into armed resistance during the March First Independence Movement. This memorial hall was built on Manse Pass, which was the assembly area during the March First Independence Movement that achieved 'two days of liberation' after defeating the Japanese colonialists through most intense resistance.

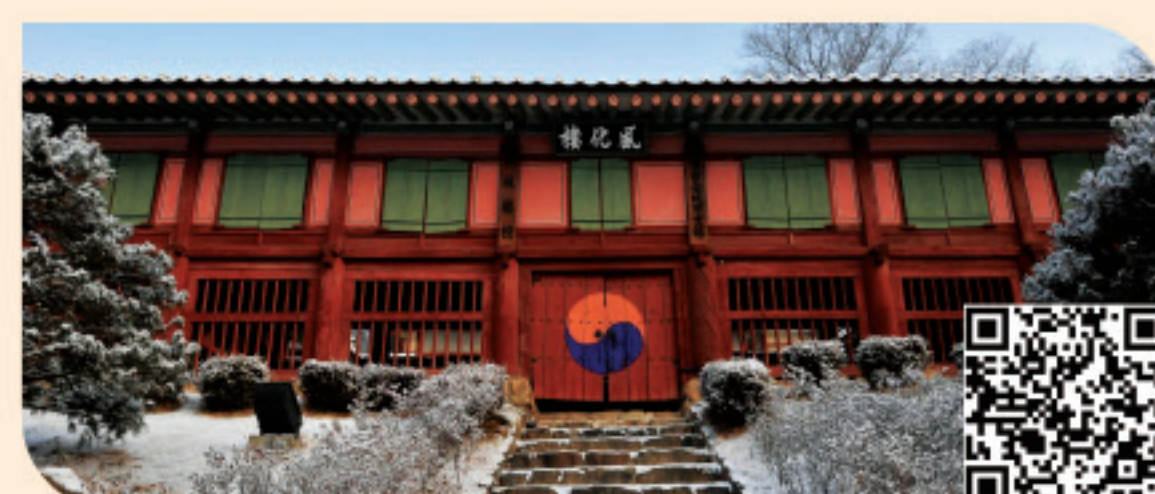

4B Jukjusanseong Fortress

It was a location of strategic advantage and good military fortress, which connected the three southern regions of Chungcheong, Jeolla, and Gyeongsang with Seoul. In every war, all states in the region fought brutally to take control of this place.

3D Anseong Hyanggyo

It was built in the 27th year of King Jungjong's reign (1532), the 11th king of the Joseon dynasty. Currently, Daejeongjeon Hall, Myeongyundang Lecture Hall, East Library, and Sammun can be found as well as Punghwaru, which is not found in other hyanggyo (local Confucian school).

2B Yangseong Hyanggyo

Yangseong Hyanggyo, which was founded in the 28th year of King Jungjong's reign (1533), has a typical fanhakhmuo structure, where Myeongyundang Lecture Hall, a study space, is located in front, and Daejeongjeon Shrine, a place of ancestral rites, is located at the back.

3D Anseonggaeksa

Gaeksa is an official residence or hotel building that was built in each county during the Goryeo and Joseon dynasties. It was a facility where the county head performed mandatoryly. It is also used as lodging for foreign envoys.
